






Get to know your Harvard organisation at Harvard University








GET TO KNOW YOUR MENTORS

Terms and Conditions

- 1) The fee covers academic fees during the programme at Malvern College, stay and meals for 7 nights and 8 days at the Malvern College Boarding Facility (each room will be on a sharing basis).
- 2) The check-in date would be 23rd June 2024 (3:00 PM) and check-out would be 30th June 2024 (12:00 PM).
- 3) On June 23rd, the fee includes dinner only. From June 24th to the 29th, all three meals breakfast, lunch, and dinner will be covered. On the 30th, only breakfast will be provided.
- 4) The fee does not cover airfare, visa charges, or individual expenses like sightseeing, travel on account of personal reasons, and any other expenses not directly related to the programme.
- 5) In the case of a teacher or guardian accompanying a group of students, they are permitted to drop off the students at the campus. However, classroom access during the programme will be limited to the registered participants only.
